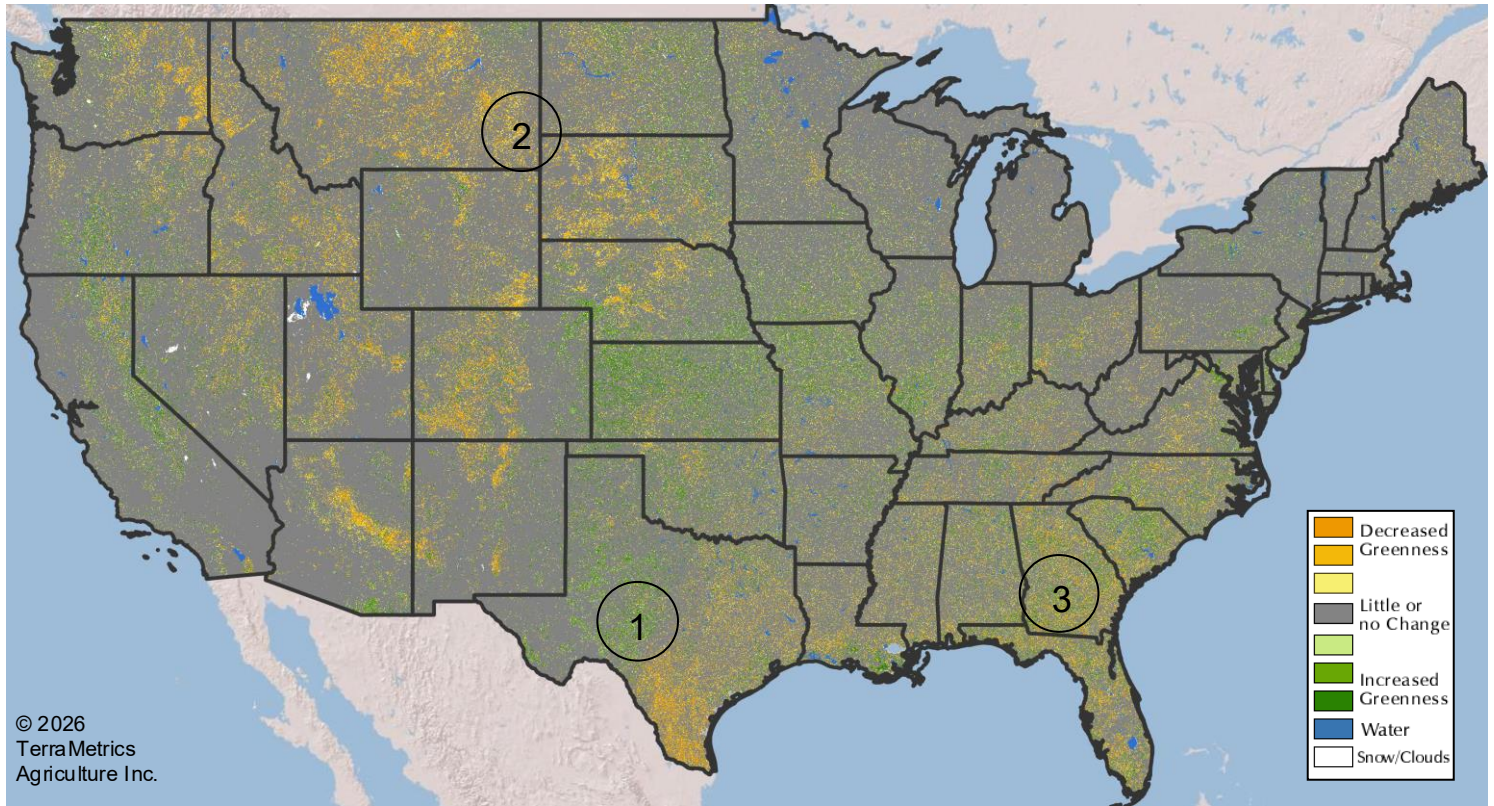


Normalized Differential Vegetation Index | Period 29, July 6 - July 20, 2026

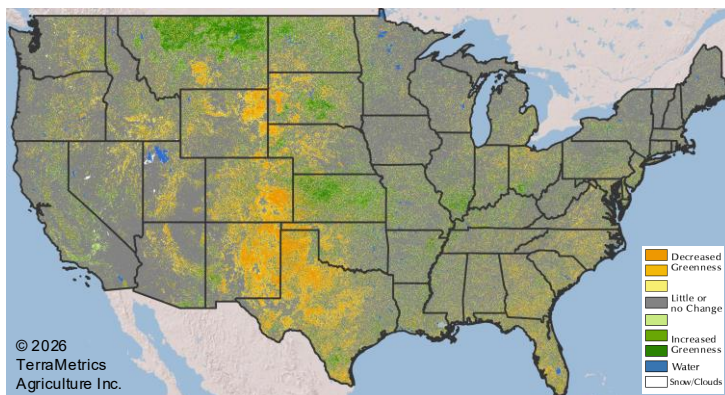
Highlights... Changes Since Last Week

Issued: July 22, 2026

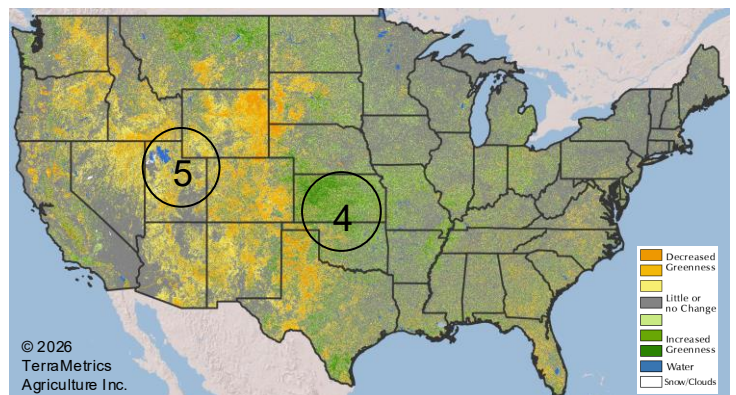


1. A prolonged period of intense rainfall impacted south-central Texas and surrounding regions. Some areas received more than 20 inches of rain over the course of a week, resulting in widespread flash flooding and significant river flooding.
2. Dry conditions across the northern Plains were paired with extreme temperatures. These conditions have placed additional stress on rangeland vegetation and summer crops in the region..
3. Excessive rainfall across portions of the southeast contributed to lower vegetation greenness.
4. Kansas and parts of the central Plains are exhibiting markedly greener vegetation conditions than is typical for this time of year.
5. Much of the western United States continues to experience abnormally to exceptionally dry conditions.

USDA CROP CONDITIONS Week of July 20, 2026

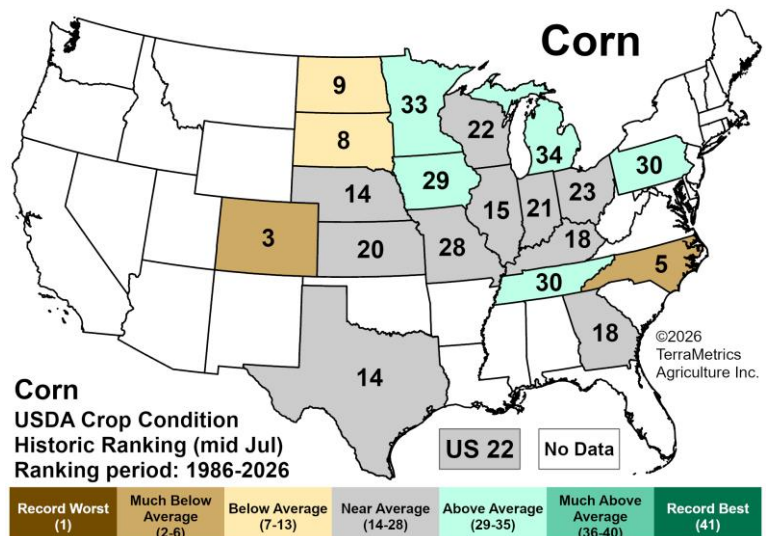
The table below contains crop condition percentages from the most recent state-level USDA crop progress reports released 7/20/26 for the top-10 corn states. **For comparison, numbers from last week (7/13/26) are shown in parentheses.**

"Historic Rank" was determined by compiling nearby condition rating since the mid-1980s and evaluating how the latest 2026 condition ratings stack up.
